The contracts and rates are provided by the supplier/marketer and all provisioning, billing and customer service is provided by the supplier/marketer. We act as the sales agent only. Our primary focus is electricity, and we want to include more natural gas offerings. Staffing structure, organization and training.

There about 15 employees including Operations Mgr, Sales Mgr, Contract Administrators, Phone Callers to qualify and collect bills, Closers to price and generate contracts, A/P and Payroll, HR, and 3 Officers who oversee the operation along with the Operations Manager. All employees are onsite. Staff are hired and trained on our written materials including

scripts and other written material created by us or provided by suppliers.


