- {¶ 1} The Dayton Power and Light Company d/b/a AES Ohio (AES Ohio or the Company) is a public utility as defined under R.C. 4905.02. As such, the Company is subject to the jurisdiction of this Commission.
- {¶ 2} R.C. 4928.141 mandates that an electric distribution utility shall provide a standard service offer (SSO) of all competitive retail electric services necessary to maintain essential electric services to customers, including a firm supply of electric generation service, to all consumers within its certified territory. The SSO may be either a market rate offer in accordance with R.C. 4928.142 or an electric security plan (ESP) in accordance with R.C. 4928.143.
- {¶ 3} On September 26, 2022, AES Ohio filed an application that, if approved, would establish the Company's fourth ESP (ESP 4). AES Ohio also filed accompanying applications for approval of revised tariffs and for approval of accounting authority.
- {¶ 4} By Entry dated September 30, 2022, the attorney examiner issued an initial procedural schedule for this proceeding, pursuant to which a technical conference was held

on October 18, 2022, a prehearing conference was held November 1, 2022, and motions to intervene are to be filed by November 28, 2022. The Entry also directed that response time for discovery be shortened to ten calendar days and indicated that additional procedural dates would be determined by subsequent entry.

- {¶ 5} Following discussion of potential hearing dates and associated filing deadlines at the November 1, 2022 prehearing conference, the attorney examiner finds that the following procedural schedule should be established:
 - (a) A local public hearing will be conducted on February 2, 2023, at 6:00 p.m., at the Dayton Municipal Building, Commission Chambers, 101 W. Third Street, Dayton, Ohio 45402.
 - (b) All discovery requests, except notices of deposition, shall be served by February 2.
 - (c) Intervenor testimony shall be filed on or before February 13, 2023.
 - (d) The evidentiary hearing will commence on March 6, 2023, at 10:00 a.m., at the offices of the Commission, Hearing Room 11-A, 11th Floor, 180 East Broad Street, Columbus, Ohio 43215-3797.
- {¶ 6} Pursuant to Ohio Adm.Code 4901:1-35-06(A), AES Ohio should publish notice of the local public and evidentiary hearings one time in a newspaper of general circulation in each county in the Company's certified territory. The notices should not appear in the legal notices section of the newspaper. The notice should read as follows:

LEGAL NOTICE

The Public Utilities Commission of Ohio has scheduled a local hearing and an evidentiary hearing in Case No. 22-900-EL-SSO, In the Matter of the Application of The Dayton Power and Light Company d/b/a AES Ohio for Approval of Its Electric Security Plan. In this proceeding, the Commission will consider AES Ohio's application, filed September 26, 2022, requesting approval of an electric security plan for the supply of Standard Service Offer electric generation service.

The local public hearing is scheduled for the purpose of providing an opportunity for interested members of the public to testify in this proceeding. The local public hearing will be held on February 2, 2023, at 6:00 p.m., at the Dayton Municipal Building, Commission Chambers, 101 W. Third Street, Dayton, Ohio, 45402.

Thereafter, the evidentiary hearing regarding AES Ohio's application is currently scheduled to commence on Monday, March 6, 2023, at 10:00 a.m., at the offices of the Commission, 180 East Broad Street, Columbus, Ohio 43215, in Hearing Room 11-A. The evidentiary hearing will also be open to the public.
