MEMORANDUM IN SUPPORT OF MOTION FOR A PROCEDURAL SCHEDULE

Pursuant to the approved Grid Mod I stipulation, the Companies are taking a phased approach to installing distribution grid modernization technologies across their service territories. The Commission Order authorizing Grid Mod I adopted a Stipulation and Recommendation that contemplates "a cost-effective, timely transition between Grid Mod I and Grid Mod II":

During the term of this plan, the Companies agree to begin development of the next phase of grid modernization investments (Grid Mod II) using these or other technologies in order to facilitate a cost-effective, timely transition between Grid Mod I and Grid Mod II.¹

The Companies recently completed the installation of Grid Mod I technologies. On July 15, 2022, the Companies filed an Application requesting authorization for a second phase of investments ("Grid Mod II") to continue the transition to a more modern distribution grid.

The Grid Mod I stipulation provides for Commission Staff to complete an operational benefits assessment and review prior to the commencement of Grid Mod II. On November 14, 2022, Staff's consultant filed its final operational benefits assessment report in Case No. 16-481-EL-UNC. Because of the overlap between Grid Mod II and operational benefits assessment, the

Companies are considering filing supplemental testimony in Grid Mod II based on review of the auditor's recommendations.

To support a timely transition between Grid Mod I and Grid Mod II, the Companies respectfully request the following procedural schedule, which anticipates a hearing by no later than June 2023, and a Commission Order by the end of 2023:

Companies' Supplemental Testimony due	March 1, 2023
Motions to intervene due	April 1, 2023
Last day to serve written discovery on the Companies (other than depositions)	May 1, 2023
Intervenor testimony due	May 15, 2023
Staff testimony due	May 22, 2023
Procedural conference	June 5, 2023
Hearings	June 12, 2023

To date, seven parties have moved to intervene, and the Companies do not oppose their intervention. No party will be prejudiced by the proposed schedule, which provides eleven months between the application filing and the hearing date.

For the foregoing reasons, the Companies respectfully request that a procedural schedule be established as set forth above.
