This charge is in excess of the supply charges that continue to climb. We keep using less energy. Over more than a quarter of a century, we have switched from incandescent lighting to CFL. From CFL to LED. We turn off everything we can when we are not using it. We do not run the dryer and the air conditioner at the same time. We have switched from window A/C units to Central Air. We keep reducing, but he bills still increase.

We have to have electricity to work, to live, to function, but it is difficult to continue to function when we are charged more and more for the membership fee in the electricity club we cannot escape.

In a world of free choice, this is a forced fee and we are trapped in this system. Please do not increase the the delivery charges.
