UNOPPOSED MOTION FOR CONTINUANCE BY AES OHIO

Pursuant to Ohio Adm.Code 4901-1-13(A) and for good cause shown, The Dayton Power and Light Company d/b/a AES Ohio moves for a continuance of the evidentiary hearing that is currently set to commence on August 1, 2023. Apr. 18, 2023 Entry. AES Ohio asks that the hearing be rescheduled to commence no earlier than September 5, 2023. Counsel for AES Ohio is unavailable to attend a hearing the week of July 31, 2023 due to summer travel, and will be in hearing the week of August 21, 2023 in another Commission proceeding.¹ A continuance until at least September 5, 2023 will avoid these conflicts and enable the parties to explore whether a mutually-agreeable resolution of these proceedings is achievable. AES Ohio further asks the Commission to update the deadlines for filing testimony to align with any new hearing date.²

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MEMORANDUM IN SUPPORT

Pursuant to R.C. 4928.143(F), following the end of each annual period of an approved electric security plan, the Commission is required to evaluate if any adjustments resulted in significantly excessive earnings for the electric utility. *Accord:* Ohio Adm.Code 4901:1-35-10.

In these proceedings, AES Ohio seeks administration of the significantly excessive earnings test under R.C. 4928.143(F) and Ohio Adm.Code 4901:1-35-10 for calendar years 2020 and 2021 in Case Nos. 21-588-EL-UNC and 22-514-EL-UNC, respectively. The Commission recently consolidated these proceedings and established a procedural schedule, which includes the commencement of an evidentiary hearing on August 1, 2023. Apr. 18, 2023 Entry, ¶ 8.

AES Ohio asks that the hearing be rescheduled to begin no earlier than September 5, 2023. Counsel for AES Ohio is unavailable to attend a hearing the week of July 31, 2023 due to summer travel, and will be in hearing the week of August 21, 2023 in another Commission proceeding.³ A continuance until at least September 5, 2023 will avoid these conflicts and enable the parties to explore whether a mutually-agreeable resolution of these proceedings is achievable.
