MR. CONWAY: Thank you, Your Honor. I just wanted to welcome everyone to the public hearing. This is a local public hearing today in the Electric Security Plan case, known informally as ESP No. 5, I believe.

MS. MARCELLETTI: We also have in 1 2. the hall representatives of the Commission's 3 Public Affairs Department and Service Monitoring and Enforcement Department. They 4 5 are available if you have any questions concerning the Commission's process, if you 6 need assistance in accessing any of the documents submitted in this case docket, or if 8 you just have general questions about the 10 hearing tonight.

And, at this time, I would like to take the appearances of the parties starting with FirstEnergy.

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MR. KNIPE: Good evening, Your
Honors, Commissioner Conway, Counsel on behalf
of The Cleveland Electric Illuminating Company,
I'm Brian Knipe. Also appearing as counsel for
the Illuminating Company from the Benesch Law
Firm is Trevor Alexander. I also have with me
Santino Fanelli, Director of Rates and
Regulatory Affairs for Ohio, as well as, Andrew
Shaffer for Ohio Regulatory Affairs.

In addition, we anticipate that some of those in attendance this evening are customers, who may have questions that maybe

don't relate to the Electric Security Plan that is before the Commission, but rather relate to their personal circumstances, their bills or 3 their service. So outside the hearing room, we 5 have a table. It has a blue table cloth on it, where we have employees ready to help the 6 7 customers, who have these types of issues. the employees that are here to help include 8 members of our customer experience 10 organization, including our Vice President of 11 Customer Engagement, Mark Jones, as well as, 12 our Vice President of Customer Care, Ken straw, 13 and members of their organization. 14 And then, in addition, to help 15 customers, we also have members of our local 16 affairs organization, Manager of Regional 17 Internal Affairs, Terry Killeen, and other 18 members of that organization. - 20 | filed for intervention in this case.
- Ohio Edison Company, The Cleveland
- 22 | Electric Illuminating Company and The Toledo
- 23 Edison Company, which we will refer to
- 24 collectively as FirstEnergy, filed this
- 25 application on April 5, 2023, requesting

authority to establish a standard service offer in the form of an Electric Security Plan for the period commencing June 1, 2024, and continuing through May 31, 2032.

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The purpose of this evening's public hearing is to receive comments from the public, regarding the application that has been filed by the companies in this case. This is not a question-and-answer session, but it is an opportunity to let the Commission know what you think about the company's request. Tonight's local public hearing, as well as the other two scheduled local hearings, are only one aspect of the process. There will also be another evidentiary hearing for the parties who have been granted intervention to present their case to the Commission. This evidentiary hearing is currently scheduled to commence on November 7, 2023, and will be held at the Commission's offices in Columbus.

Upon your arrival, you had the opportunity to sign up to testify tonight. We have those sign up sheets, and after I finish with the introduction, we will begin by inviting individuals to come up and speak in

the order that they signed up. Each person who signed up to testify will be permitted to speak once about the application, and to help things run smoothly, we will also call up those who are next on deck so that you can make your way forward to speak, after the person who is testifying completes their statement.

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Before you present your testimony, we will ask you to take an oath, or an affirmation, that what you are about to say is the truth. We will also ask you to state your name for the record, then, you will be free to make your remarks. And we just ask for efficiency sake that you try to limit remarks to around five minutes, and if you have any prepared written comments, that you also provide our court reporter a copy of them. What is said and heard by the court reporter will be introduced into the record in this case.

Counsel for the parties to this case, attorney examiners are permitted to ask you questions about your statement. We will ask counsel as a group whether there are any questions for the witness. Any counsel who

wishes to pursue cross-examination must respond, or we will presume that you do not have questions for that particular witness.

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The testimony that you provide tonight will be considered a part of the official record in this case, and it will be reviewed by the Commission, before a final decision is rendered. As counsel for FirstEnergy already pointed out, should you have specific questions about the application, the representatives are here, and, certainly, willing to speak with you, and, again, our staff is also available should you have any questions about the Commission's process.

A few other notes. If you decided that you do not want to testify when we read your name from the sign-in sheet, you can pass to the next witness. If you decided that you prefer to file written comments in the case docket, our staff can answer your questions about how to do so. Also, once you finish testifying, or you are here just to observe, you may leave the hearing at any time you wish.

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MS. ADDISON: The first name I have on the list of those who have signed up to testify this evening is Don Bryant; next, on the list, I have Larry Bresler.

Welcome, Mr. Bryant. Please raise your right hand. Do you swear the testimony you are about to provide in this proceeding is the truth?

MR. BRYANT: Yes.

MS. ADDISON: Thank you. Please state your name for the record.

MR. BRYANT: My name is Don Bryant and I reside in North Royalton, Ohio. I am a participant of the greater Cleveland

organization, Utilities for All, which advocates for low income utility customers in our region. Utility consumption rates have climbed considerably in Ohio, along with the cost of almost everything else; inflation and rate increases hit low income people the hardest. I am pleased that funds have been made available for consumers who have fallen behind on their utility bills through the Fuel Fund Program administered by two agencies in Cleveland, greater Cleveland.

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I am concerned now that the fuel funding may be ending under the new security, Electric Security Plan, or ESP. This could be an economic undoing for individuals with families that live paycheck to paycheck. I come in and PUCO and FirstEnergy continued administration of the Customer Advisory Program to help all customers, to assist them in finding ways to reduce their electric usage, and helping all of them reduce their electrical rates. This is offered to small businesses, too.

I ask that you continue funding these programs and increase the allocation, as

more people are struggling, while FirstEnergy 1 2. profits are up, as campaign contributions have 3 been very generously distributed by FirstEnergy. In 2015 and 2018 election cycles 4 5 for FirstEnergy's political action committee and employees contributed over \$1.2 million to 6 legislative and statewide candidates, including contributions to Supreme Court candidates of 8 Ohio.

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During the 2018 election cycle, the FirstEnergy PAC, (PAC), had hit the primary and general election campaign contribution limits by contributing \$25,415 to Larry Householder's campaign committee, Friends of Householder.

During the last two election cycles, 2015 and 2018, FirstEnergy's PAC and employees contributed \$281,717 to republican party committees and \$45,500 to democratic party committees. During the 2018 election, Larry Householder had his eye on being the Speaker.

The non-profit news agency, Inside Climate News, noted that a dozen republican candidates received contributions of the same size from Friends of Householder, \$7,707, during the 2018 primaries. Seven of these

Bresler. I live in Shaker Heights, Ohio. I am the Director of an organization called Organize Ohio. I am also a member of the Northeast Ohio's Public Utilities for All Coalition and the coordinating committee of the Ohio Poor Peoples' Campaign.

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Beginning in June this year,
FirstEnergy customers had seen their rates
double through their, the SSO costs. Now,
FirstEnergy is asking for an additional
\$1.4 billion through the Electric Security
Plan. I've seen some explanation for this,
but, just, it's still not clear to me why that

much is needed.

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I am particularly concerned, as we've had these increases, about the impact would be on lower income utility consumers.

Following the worst of the COVID pandemic, there were many where many consumers who fell substantially behind. As the June increase happened, the number of FirstEnergy customers, who have had their utilities shut off or are facing shutoffs is certainly increasing substantially. This can have dire medical consequences for frail utility users during the summer months, which will only increase as the summers now become hotter.

In many cases, these shutoffs continue, even in the winter months, even after the onset of winter moratorium, because customers do not have the money to be able to pay what is necessary to have their utilities turned back on. Not only does this have direct medical consequences, but it has ancillary consequences, such as children being removed from their parents and placed in foster care, due to the fact that they have lack of power. This will no doubt increase dramatically as

time goes on, if the new \$1.4 billion hike is approved.

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A small safety net for some has been utility assistance programs that have received and rely upon funds from FirstEnergy. Here in Cleveland, those funds have gone to the Cleveland Housing Partners and Step Forward, Step Forward Cleveland, and other organizations have received these funds in other parts of the FirstEnergy service area. The energy assistance programs have been a vital, although, limited program to assist low income utility customers to keep their utilities on.

The contracts for those funds will be ending in 2024. It is critical that any increase given to FirstEnergy for its rate hike includes, not only a continuation of funding for these programs by FirstEnergy, but, at least, the doubling of the amount of funding given all the problems that exist. This will make a small dent in the necessary efforts to keep power turned on for FirstEnergy consumers. Thank you.

MS. ADDISON: Thank you. Any questions from counsel -- Mr. Meissner.

- MR. MEISSNER: Thank you. I have one question. Mr. Bresler, you used the term in your testimony, "moratorium," what did you mean by that and how does that have any affect upon this case?
- MS. ADDISON: Mr. Meissner, is
 Mr. Bresler representing an organization that
 has intervened in this proceeding that you are
 representing?
- MR. MEISSNER: He's part of an organization. I don't know if he represents them.
- MS. ADDISON: But you are representing --

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- MR. MEISSNER: The organization.
- MS. ADDISON: Thank you. Please proceed, Mr. Bresler.
 - MR. BRESLER: As -- we have a yearly winter moratorium that begins in, I don't know, October and ends in May -- I may have that wrong, which is greatly vitally needed, but, of course, the utilities have already been turned off, then, you have to pay what is necessary to get them turned on, and, if you have the money to do that, then, the

1 | moratorium isn't any good for you.

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2 MS. ADDISON: Thank you very much.

MR. MEISSNER: Thank you.

MS. ADDISON: The next name I have on our list this evening is Lou, and, then, the next person up would be David Guran. Welcome. Please raise your right hand. Do you swear the testimony you are about to provide is the truth?

LOU: Yes, I do.

MS. ADDISON: Thank you. Please state your name and then you can make your statement.

LOU: Hi, good evening. I am Lou. I am a homeless person staying in a homeless shelter. Our economy has been down, since the recession. Homeless people, our number has been increasing in our area. One particular issue people do not understand is, without the electricity, you actually tell them and they give you a hotel voucher issued by HUD; that means, through your local housing authority.

Unfortunately, in the shelter, we

have so many people, they became homeless -- yeah, utilities are the reason -- not only the

landlord not responsible for all the repairing; old wiring, false wiring, will cause them to have huge electricity bills they cannot afford, so, eventually, they become delinquently, then, you get it shut off.

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However, throughout this hard time, we have also lost a lot of population. The people remaining in the areas are the people who don't have extra means to move out of here, so, now, these people are facing daily struggles, including the electricity bills.

All these companies do not give us the clear bills for us to truly understand what we are paying for; just because we are poor, we don't deserve to have the same quality of the service? I think that's really wrong. It's discrimination, of course, however, even there are programs; PUCO cannot really watch all of these companies and how they carry out all their services. So we have lots of people, not only became delinquent; they deny them notifications. They did not give them warning. They did not even get help from the customer service, as what the plan -- they always submit to the PUCO and their power gets shut off -- it

could be happening in the severe cold wintertime or an extremely hot day in the summertime.

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Without electricity, the low income population are with all kinds of health issues they cannot survive. Their voucher from HUD, from Public Housing Authority, means nothing. They have to become homeless, okay -- why -- because when you have power shut off, there's no way for these people to get easy answers in order to get assistance and to get the power turned back on. Back in 2021, August, we had to pick the warmer weather to have a vigil for the people who died back in January and February that same year without electricity.

We do know lots of people right now in the community and I think that's what we need in Cuyahoga County or City of Cleveland, who depend on electricity to power their oxygen machine and C-Pak machine; without electricity, it's being shut off, not through their own fault -- it could be a letter or it could be some bureaucracy through the government -- they lose electricity and they can lose their life at the same time.

reasonable rate, having renewable energy to make sure our environment is sustainable is very important to everybody, especially, the people without big incomes. These people are actually the workforce, but, now, we are either stuck in a shelter to go through the bureaucracy of the shelter system, or people be on the street getting in trouble with the law, and, now, they are in jail -- that's incarceration.

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So having good electricity rules, having a good organization supervise all these companies to make sure the safety plans are actually working is important, because it's about peoples' lives. With people, we are struggling with our daily life. We cannot really watch how things like what Mr. Larry Householder are doing; we depend on you.

Please help all of us to make sure that electricity rates cannot be raised, just because they tell you, oh, they lose benefit, because this is a different kind of murder, which is unjust and unlawful, and, I believe, to a certain degree, unconstitutional.

Thank you very much. If you have any questions, I'm here to answer.

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MS. ADDISON: Thank you. Any questions from counsel? No questions. Thank you very much for your statement this evening.

LOU: Thank you for listening.

MS. ADDISON: As I noted before, the next name I have is David Guran. Welcome. Please raise your right hand. Do you swear the testimony you are about to provide in this proceeding is the truth?

MR. GURAN: Yes.

MS. ADDISON: Thank you. Please state your name for the record.

MR. GURAN: My name is David Guran. I reside in Akron, Ohio. I didn't realize until tonight that you're all still in Akron, but here I am. I am also part of Utilities For All -- a part-time member -- let's put it that way. Also, I'm the advocate try chair for the Poor People's Campaign of Ohio, and i am here tonight as one who lives in Akron, headquarters of FirstEnergy.

With the Larry Householder scandal, which included a bribe that was initiated by

FirstEnergy; the CEO, Chuck Jones and the Vice President Mike Dowling, this is not the first time that FirstEnergy has done this type of scandal. I believe it was back in the 1990s that a similar scandal happened at FirstEnergy. Are we going to allow this a third time? We need the Public Utilities Commission to work for the customers.

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Now, I know you also have a mandate to give the shareholders a decent return, but, nowadays, with banks, like, Chase Bank, giving interest savings accounts less than 1%; the same type of return should go to the investors. This is, investing into a utility is guaranteed money to an investor, but it shouldn't be a gravy train.

And then this group -- it used to be run by the former disgraced PCO Chairman, Sam Randazzo. This Commission now needs to show the community that you learned from his mistakes, from his wrongdoing -- we need to see that.

I have said, before the city council of Akron, that FirstEnergy is a criminal organization (on the vernacular) they

haven't actually been convicted yet. But they
did actually something very similar to a
company that I used to work for. I used to
work for Commonwealth Edison in Illinois, which
is now called Exelon. I worked at a power
plant called Zion nuclear generator plant,

which is now closed, as a chemist.

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The exact same kind of scandal happened in Illinois as Ohio, and, right now, they've been fighting it out with the former speaker of the state legislature and the various -- the CEO of Exelon. This needs to stop. And, as a former employee, I know there's graps within utilities.

You need to do your job. You need to stop this. Thank you.

MS. ADDISON: Thank you, Mr. Guran. Mr. Guran, if you could just wait to see if counsel has any questions.

MR. GURAN: Sure.

MS. ADDISON: Any questions from counsel for this witness? Thank you very much for your statement. That does conclude the number of individuals that have signed up to testify. I would like to open the floor up for

anyone who may not have had a chance to sign up prior to sitting down this evening, who has not already testified. Okay.

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And with that, we will take a brief break to allow individuals a chance to come into the council chambers, in the event they are running a little bit late this evening. So we will take a quick fifteen minute break, just to allow folks another chance to get here on time and then we have some concluding remarks. Thank you very much. Let's go off the record.

(Whereupon, a recess was taken.)

MS. MARCELLETTI: Back on the record. That concludes the witnesses who signed up to testify. Is there anyone else present this evening, who would like to testify and did not sign up? Seeing none. Thank you to everyone for their participation.

I think we understand. I know that it's not easy to stand up and talk publicly, particularly, for those who don't do it frequently. We appreciate the time that everyone has been preparing themselves and attending and presenting your comments tonight. So thank you very much.

MS. MARCELLETTI: Thank you, again, Commissioner. We would also like to thank Cleveland City Hall for allowing us to use their facilitates to conduct this public
