My name is Jesse Davis. I am the

administrative law judge assigned to this case by the Power Siting Board to hear testimony this evening.

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Members of the board staff are present. They are over in this right corner of the room near the door.

And if you have questions about the board's process or the staff report which was filed in the docket in this case, feel free to stop by their table after the hearing and ask them any questions you might have on those topics or about something like submitting written commentary to the board's website, if you'd like to do that, and you will be testifying later on tonight.

At this time, I want to take appearances. And I'll just note for the record that no party has thus far moved to intervene in the case, so we'll just take an appearance for the company.

So appearing on behalf of ATSI?

MR. HUGHES: Brad Hughes on behalf of

THE COURT: Thank you.

American Transmission Systems, Incorporated.

So the subject of this evening's hearing is an application filed by ATSI on March 7th of 2023. In the application, the ATSI seeks approval to construct a new 345-kilovolt four-breaker ring bus station on a nine-acre site to be called the Melbourne

station, and a new 345-kilovolt transmission line extending approximately 9 miles from ATSI existing Dowling-Fulton transmission line in Fulton County, Ohio.

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Additionally, as part of this project, ATSI seeks approval to construct two approximately half-mile-long 345-kilovolt transmission line -- tie lines to connect the existing customer-owned Sydney substation to the proposed Melbourne substation.

According to the application, the project will mitigate a violation of PJM

Interconnection's and FirstEnergy's planning criteria, which is a loss of load greater than 300 megawatts, by adding redundancy through a second 345-kilovolt source via the proposed Melbourne station to the existing North Star BlueScope Steel's Sydney substation.

Further, the project will enable ATSI to meet projected service loads needs, as well as provide operational flexibility to customers.

Board staff filed its report of investigation on November 21, 2023. This report is a recommendation of the board staff and does not necessarily the board's final determination in this matter.

The purpose of this evening's public

hearing is to receive testimony regarding the application from persons in the local community who are affected by the proposed project. Tonight's hearing will not be a question-and-answer session, but rather an opportunity for you to tell the board what you think about the proposed project. Tonight's public hearing is on one aspect of this process.

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An evidentiary hearing is scheduled to commence on January 9, 2024, at the board's offices in Columbus. The purpose of the evidentiary hearing is to allow the parties and board staff to provide testimony and other evidence into the record regarding the proposed project.

Tonight's hearing is being recorded by a court reporter who is over here to my right. So if you do plan to testify, I just please ask that you speak loudly and clearly in his direction so that he can accurately reflect your comments on the record. Also, if you have prepared a written statement and you'd like to submit, it would be helpful if you could provide a copy to the court reporter or to me for reference to ensure that our transcript is accurate, recognizing that only your testimony will offered as far as the transcript.

After I finish my introduction, I'm

going to begin inviting individuals who are on the sign-in sheet to speak about the proposed project.

Each person who signed up to testify will be permitted to speak once about the proposed project.

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Before that person or any person present their testimony, I'll just ask that you take an oath or affirmation that what you're about to say is the truth, and I'll have a few preliminary questions for the record, including someone's name and address and if they work or reside within the project's area.

Counsel for ATSI and myself will also be permitted to ask questions about the statement provided in the group test -- or spoken testimony.

I'll ask -- and if there is any sense of whether there is any examination for a witness, if you have questions, just let me know. Just wave me down about that.

Any testimony provided tonight will be considered part of the official record of this case, and it will be considered by the board when they make their decision on the application.

A few other just kind of quick notes.

If someone signed up and you decide you'd rather not

for any reason, you can certainly pass to the next

witness. If you'd like to do that, that's fine. Just let me know. And if you just decide ultimately that you signed up but you'd rather just write something and submit it, that's fine. You can let me know that, and then the gentleman over there by the table can provide you with a sheet that tells you how to give the board your written testimony if you'd like to do something like that.

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For efficiency's sake, I'd just ask that anyone speaking, try to limit it to five minutes, if possible, but I know if you have something to say, just say it. That's fine. But it's kind of a guidepost.

And then if you decide that you have additional comments on top of what you said after you've said it, you can certainly file those as written comments. And again, the folks over there will tell you how to do that.

With all that said, I think we're good to go. So we can start with the first person who signed up. And I apologize sincerely if I butcher your last name, but it looks like Robert Trowbridge.
