Ohio American Water has applied, as

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you know, for an increase in its rates, and the purpose of our hearing tonight is for us to be able to hear your testimony, your comments and concerns about the rates and about the service that you may get from Ohio American.

What we are going to do is I will allow any of you who wish to present testimony, you can make either sworn statements or unsworn statements.

If you make sworn statements, then you will be subject to cross-examination by the parties in the case. You can also choose just to make unsworn statements. They will not receive as much weight in the consideration by the Commission, but the Commission will consider your testimony regardless of the situation.

In the event that you have concerns or complaints that you would like to express, we have two members of the staff of the Public Utilities Commission here who you can talk to if you'd like to.

There are also representatives of the company, someone in particular they should speak to.

That's why I am here. I was rather alarmed by the amount, and we have seen other rate increases that have been requested, only not in this area or in the state not even going up over a percent.

When you look at interest rates here of late, the last several years being in the three to four percent range, it seemed very alarming that much would be requested.

Going on beyond just the rate increase but the lack of communication saying what it might be for, I think this is the first

I heard your reading it was for security
increases, and I can see a little bit of
increase for the things. They need to protect
for infrastructure, but it is still alarming
that would be that much without any increase in

6 the infrastructure and the service to us, the

7 | customers.

And I guess that goes back to trying to remember when Ohio American Water actually took over the service in our area, but there were indications, unwritten, of increased service, better service, because we do have some failures in the infrastructure of the water, some that haven't been addressed, and now that's been brought up in this rate increase.

I look at the rate increase as being something that is unfounded and no evidence to support it. I really have a lot of questions in regard to it.

EXAMINER LESSER: Does the community have an association?

MR. EVERSOLE: Lake White

Association does exist. To be honest, I read

about this, and we have had family matters. I

haven't been able to get the rest of the association, but there is a Lake White

Association, and normally when things like this come up, there's other people calling me, so I was surprised when someone didn't call me. We have had some change in people moving here recently. That may not have happened.

EXAMINER LESSER: The association is usually on the service list for the staff report of the case.

MR. EVERSOLE: With changes in people moving, that may not have been circulated. I just saw it the other night in the paper. That's the one and only notice I've seen.

EXAMINER LESSER: At least we know it got published.

MR. EVERSOLE: Just a paragraph, there's hardly any information why was the rate increase, just there's going to be a hearing.

When I called the city, the mayor's office, they didn't have any idea about it. I actually called the Ohio Consumers Office, and they were the ones that told me about who, what,
