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

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The following rates, rules and regulations for electric service are applicable throughout Toledo Edison's service territory except as noted.

GENERAL SERVICE RULES AND REGULATIONS

The PUCO approval of the above tariff language in respect to the limitation of liability arising from the Company's negligence does not constitute a determination that such limitation language should be upheld in a court of law. Approval by the Commission merely recognizes that since it is a court's responsibility to adjudicate negligence and consequent damage claims, it should be also the court's responsibility to determine the validity of the exculpatory clause.

SERVICE CONTINUITY:

- (17) The Company shall not be liable for any loss, cost, damage or expense which the Customer may sustain by reason of damage to or destruction of any property, including the loss of use thereof arising out of, or in any manner connected with interruptions in service, variations in service characteristics, high or low voltage, phase failure, phase reversal, the use of electrical appliances or the presence of the Company's property on the Customer's premises whether such damages are caused by or involve any fault, failure or negligence of the Company or otherwise except such damages which are caused by or due to the willful and wanton misconduct of the Company.

The PUCO approval of the above tariff language in respect to the limitation of liability arising from the Company's negligence does not constitute a determination that such limitation language should be upheld in a court of law. Approval by the Commission merely recognizes that since it is a court's responsibility to adjudicate negligence and consequent damage claims, it should be also the court's responsibility to determine the validity of the exculpatory clause.

Any customer desiring protection against any or all of the foregoing shall furnish, at the customer's expense, any equipment desired by the Customer for such purpose. Interruptions in service shall not relieve the Customer from any charges provided in the rate schedule.

SERVICE VOLTAGE LEVELS:

- (18) The nominal values of the Company's standard secondary voltages are 120/240 Volts, 120/208 Y Volts, and 277/480 Y Volts, while the standard primary voltages are 4160 Volts and 7200/12470 Y Volts. For service at higher levels of voltage the nominal standards are 23,000 Volts, 34,500 Volts, 69,000 Volts and 138,000 Volts. For customers served at voltages at less than 15,000 Volts, the company designs its system so that under normal operating conditions the sustained service voltage is within a range of plus or minus five percent of the nominal voltage level of the service. For customers served at voltages of more than 15,000 Volts, the Company designs its system so that under normal operating conditions the sustained service voltage is within a range of plus or minus ten percent of the nominal voltage level of the service. Whenever voltages shall be known to exist outside of such ranges, the Company will take steps to promptly initiate correction action to restore the sustained voltage level within said ranges.

RESALE:

- (19) The service furnished is for the sole use of the customer, who shall not sell any of such service to any other person, partnership, corporation, or other entity, or permit any other person, partnership, corporation, or other entity to use the same, except:
- (I) Where the landlord furnishes electricity as a part of the consideration for the total rent charged and there is no metering, check metering, checking, measuring, estimating, calculating ,
