ENTRY NUNC PRO TUNC

The Commission finds:

- (1) The applicant, The Cincinnati Gas & Electric Company (CG&E), filed applications in these matters to modify its nonresidential generation rates to provide for market-based standard service offer pricing and to establish an alternative competitive-bid process subsequent to the end of the market development period, to permit it to defer costs and investments, and to establish a rider to recover certain capital investments.
- (2) On November 23, 2004, the Commission issued an entry on rehearing in the above-captioned cases.
- (3) With regard to fuel and economy purchased power component of the charges (FPP), the Commission inadvertently directed CG&E to file, within ten days following the issuance of the entry on rehearing, an application to establish the FPP for 2005 (entry on rehearing at 10-11).

The Commission intended that CG&E would make quarterly submissions to Commission staff, at least 30 days before the start of

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each quarter, such that staff may review CG&E's proposed FPP charge for the upcoming quarter. The first such quarterly filing was what the Commission meant for CG&E to submit to staff within ten days after the issuance of the entry on rehearing.

The Commission also intended that the annual FPP filing would initiate a Commission review of the preceding four quarters' FPP charges. This review process will allow the Commission to adjust the FPP charges as appropriate. The Commission clarifies that the first annual FPP filing should therefore be made by September 1, 2005.


- (4) With regard to the system reliability tracker (SRT), the Commission inadvertently set two different deadlines for the filing of an application to set the initial SRT charge (entry on rehearing at 10, 11). The Commission clarifies that it intended that CG&E make that application by ten days after the issuance of the entry on rehearing, in order to permit implementation of the SRT by January 1, 2005.


It is, therefore,

ORDERED, That the entry on rehearing dated November 23, 2004, be amended, nunc pro tunc, as set forth above. It is, further,


ORDERED, That a copy of this entry nunc pro tunc be served upon all parties of record.


