ENTRY

The Attorney Examiner, pursuant to the authority granted by Rule 4901-1-14, Ohio Administrative Code, (O.A.C.), finds:

- (1) On April 18, 2005, Cathy S. Godsey (Ms. Godsey), spokesperson for the complainants, and numerous other subscribers of the Cooney Exchange of Frontier Communications (Frontier) filed a petition with the Commission requesting EAS between the Cooney Exchange of Frontier and the Edon, Montpelier, and Bryan exchanges of Verizon North Inc. (Verizon).
- (2) Following filing of the petition, the attorney examiner contacted Frontier officials to learn of options available to Ms. Godsey other than EAS. The attorney examiner discussed his findings with Ms. Godsey and indicated that he would contact her in several weeks to learn if she wished to continue with the EAS proceeding.


- (3) On August 24, 2005, Ms. Godsey informed the attorney examiner that she would no longer pursue her EAS request. Ms. Godsey stated that she would file a letter indicating that she would withdraw her petition.
- (4) The attorney examiner attempted to contact Ms. Godsey by telephone numerous times during the month of September 2005 to remind Ms. Godsey to file the withdrawal letter. The attempts to contact Ms. Godsey were unsuccessful.
- (5) The attorney examiner will recommend to the Commission that Ms. Godsey's petition be dismissed unless she contacts the attorney examiner no later than October 14, 2005, and informs him that she wants to continue with the EAS request.

It is, therefore,

ORDERED, That Ms. Godsey contact the attorney examiner no later than October 14, 2005, to inform him whether she wishes to pursue her EAS request. If the attorney examiner is not contacted by that date, he will recommend that the Commission dismiss Ms. Godsey's petition. It is, further,

ORDERED, That a copy of this entry be served upon Ms. Godsey and all other interested persons of record.


