ENTRY

The Commission finds:

- (1) The Applicant, The Dayton Power and Light Company, is a public utility as defined in Section 4905.02, Revised Code, and, as such, is subject to the jurisdiction of this Commission.
- (2) On December 24, 1996, the Commission's Opinion and Order adopted Guidelines Relating to Conjunctive Electric Service (CES) and directed electric utilities to file applications to amend their tariffs to implement such a service. The Guidelines provide for multiple customer locations or accounts to be aggregated for the purpose of rate design, electric service negotiations, and billing.
- (3) In accordance with the Opinion and Order, the company has filed, for Commission review and approval, a CES tariff. The tariff provides a new service that would be available to any customer that meets certain applicability requirements and enters into an agreement with the company to be approved by the Commission pursuant to Section 4905.31, Revised Code.
- (4) Through the submission of its CES tariff application of December 4, 1998, the company simultaneously withdraws its CES application filed on March 31, 1997. The tariff, as submitted on December 28, 1998, includes additions, deletions and modifications as requested by Commission Staff and other parties that participated in meetings designed to make the tariff a useful tool for customers. While the tariff does not represent a formal agreement among the parties, it incorporates many of the ideas discussed in those meetings.
- (5) After a thorough review of the application, Staff finds that the proposed tariff conforms to the Opinion and Order and is just

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and reasonable and, therefore, recommends its approval to the Commission.

- (6) Staff further recommends that the effective date of the tariff shall be January 4, 1999.
- (7) The company is to file for Commission review and approval a proposed customer notice no later than January 4, 1999. If filed on a timely basis and found acceptable, Staff will notify the company no later than January 8, 1999 and no further entry regarding customer notification shall be issued.

It is, therefore,

ORDERED, That the CES tariff contained in the application by The Dayton Power and Light Company filed on December 4, 1998 and modified on December 28, 1998 is approved and shall be effective on January 4, 1999. It is, further,

ORDERED, That the Stipulation and Recommendation submitted by the signatory parties and contained in the application be adopted. It is, further,

ORDERED, That on or prior to the effective date the company is authorized to file in final form four complete, printed copies of its CES tariff with the Commission. One copy shall be filed in this case docket, one copy should be filed with the Applicant's TRF docket, and the remaining two copies shall be designated for distribution to the Commission Staff. It is, further,

ORDERED, That the Applicant shall submit to the Commission Staff, no later than January 4, 1999 the proposed customer notice. If acceptable, the Staff shall notify the company by January 8, 1999 and the company shall notify all customers affected by the proposed tariff within 30 days. It is, further,

ORDERED, That nothing in this Finding and Order shall be binding upon this Commission in any future proceeding or investigation involving the justness or reasonableness of any rate, charge, rule or regulation. It is, further,

ORDERED, That a copy of this Finding and Order be served upon the Applicant and each party of record.

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CONCURRING OPINION OF CHAIRMAN CRAIG A. GLAZER

I want to take this opportunity to express a personal thank you to all the parties that worked on presenting acceptable Conjunctive Electric Service (CES) tariffs for our approval. As I indicated in similar comments filed with the First Energy application, this pilot program could provide demonstrable benefits to customers and companies in "getting their feet wet" in dealing with aggregation. I firmly believe that there are potential savings to customers which could occur under this program if an appropriately formed aggregated group is put together or if the aggregator agrees to undertake certain of the billing, submetering or collection functions normally undertaken by the utility. By the same token, the CES program is even more important in establishing critical "skill sets" by both customers and companies in dealing with aggregation prior to the advent of full-scale retail competition. As we have learned in the telephone and gas arenas (and the Pennsylvania Commission is finding in the electric arena), in order to make retail competition a success, not only is it necessary to have the right policies and market structures in place, but equally important are properly working "back-office systems." The utility needs to be able to handle numerous requests for alternative suppliers and to process those requests seamlessly both for customers and marketers. The CES program should provide a test of those systems on a pilot basis before full-scale retail competition is upon us.

With these filings, AEP is left as the lone Ohio company without conforming tariffs on file. I urge AEP to use this template and call a meeting of the staff and the parties so that a similar offering can be made to their customers free of the litigation that has, to date, characterized this offering.

My complements again to the parties including the electric company for their hard work and for making this offering available to the citizens of the greater Dayton area.
