ENTRY

The attorney examiner finds:

- (1) In each of the above captioned electric transition plan (hereinafter ETP) cases, the Commission approved stipulations, in which the electric companies committed to make a transmission and distribution separation filing at the Federal Energy Regulatory Commission (hereinafter FERC) no later than March 31, 2001. The approved stipulations also provide that the utilities will confer with the Commission prior to filing at FERC.
- (2) Therefore, each electric company shall file a summary of its March 31, 2001, application at FERC, and all supporting documents in the respective ETP dockets listed above, by March 2, 2001.
- (3) This entry establishes a workshop process, which will give all interested parties the opportunity to comment on the filing.
- (4) The supporting documents should include, but not be limited to, the following: 1) discussion of the particular facilities and how FERC's seven-factor test should apply to those facilities; 2) appropriate load-flow data that supports identification of network and radial use of specific lines; 3) maps that provide a picture of the transmission and distribution systems; 4) accounting decisions and identification of specific accounts and

cost separations; and 5) all other justification for decisions regarding separation of facilities.

- (5) The following public workshops shall be scheduled to give interested parties the opportunity to address all issues related to the transmission/distribution separations of the electric utilities:
  - (a) Cincinnati Gas and Electric, March 12, 2001, at 9:00 a.m.;
  - (b) Dayton Power and Light, March 12, 2001, at 1:00 p.m.;
  - (c) American Electric Power, March 13, 2001, at 9:00 a.m.; and
  - (d) Allegheny Power Systems, March 13, 2001, at 1:00 p.m.
- (6) These workshops shall be held in hearing rooms B-C, at the Commission's offices, 180 East Broad Street, Columbus, OH 43215.
- (7) Upon completion of these workshops, the Commission will find that the filings are either in compliance or noncompliance with the transmission/distribution portion of each stipulated agreement and address the separation filings.

It is, therefore,

ORDERED, That the half-day workshops listed in finding (5) be scheduled. It is, further,

ORDERED, That a copy of this Entry be served upon all parties of record.
