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Operations Expertise.

Since Eagle Energy desires to become an aggregator, the actual operation of the transmission and distribution systems will be secondary to the marketing efforts of Eagle Energy. The primary focus will be marketing lower cost alternative supplies to end-user retail distribution customers. The expertise of Eagle Energy resides in the area of contract negotiations, cost of service, tariff matters and the ability to explain these issues to end-user retail customers so they may make an intelligent decision concerning the selection of an alternative supply. See Amended Exhibit D-3 for specific details of the expertise of Eagle Energy's management team.

Eagle Energy wants to supplement its electric aggregation program so retail customers may have the opportunity to explore both gas and electric alternatives from a single entity with the required expertise. Eagle Energy has been providing electric aggregation services for over one year and has assisted end-use customers with approximately 400,000 MWH of electric load switch suppliers under the Ohio Electric Choice program. The Commission, in Case NO. 01-677-EL-AGG, Certificate No. 01-071, granted the existing authority of Eagle Energy and is in good standing with the Commission.

Key Technical Personnel.

See Exhibit A-13 for a listing of Eagle Energy's management structure. In addition, the following summarizes some of the technical background of several members of the management team.

Donald I. Marshall.

Marshall has more than thirty years' of regulatory experience. He spent twenty-five years at The Cincinnati Gas & Electric Company (CGE) and retired as Vice-President of Rate and Economic Research. He also spent six years as Assistant Vice-President of Regulatory Affairs at Cincinnati Bell and left there to be the founder of Eagle Energy. At CGE, Marshall had the responsibility of revenue requirements for gas and electric operations in three jurisdictions and appeared before this Commission on multiple occasions as an expert witness on several topics including tariff matters, management policies and practices and gas cost recovery, formerly known as purchased gas cost. Marshall developed the very first experimental gas transportation tariffs approved by this Commission. Marshall has appeared as an expert witness before this Commission in the following gas related cases:

James J. McGraw.

McGraw is a licensed attorney and started his career in the United States Air Force. While serving, McGraw represented Wright-Patterson Air Force Base in all rate proceedings involving the Dayton Power and Light Company. McGraw joined the Legal Department of CGE as the primary state attorney for regulatory matters and litigated several GCR and AIR cases before this Commission. McGraw left CGE after five years' to enter private practice.

Richard A. Lonneman.

Lonneman has more than thirty-five years' of experience with CGE and retired as Manager of Revenue Requirements. During his career at CGE, Lonneman testified as an expert witness on several occasions before this Commission on issues related to cash working capital, cost of service and rate design.
