PUBLIC INFORMATION
MEETING
July 19, 2001**

DPL Energy, LLC (the "Company") will hold a public information meeting on July 19, 2001 at the Town Hall, 35 South Chillicothe Street, South Charleston, Ohio from 6 p.m. to 7 p.m. The purpose of this meeting is for the Company to receive public comments on a proposed electric generating station to be built in Madison County, Ohio. There will be a short presentation of the proposed project at the beginning of the meeting and Company representatives will be available to answer questions that may arise from attending individuals. Anyone interested in the project is welcome to arrive at any time during the stated meeting hours to review the project plans and to discuss the project with DPL Energy personnel. This meeting is being held in compliance with Ohio Administrative Code Rule 4906.5-08 and in accordance with policies of the Ohio Power Siting Board.

PROJECT DESIGN

The proposed electric generating station will have a nominal capacity to generate 300 megawatts from six dual-fuel combustion turbine generators. The units will be primarily fueled by natural gas, with diesel fuel as a secondary fuel. Electricity generated by the facility will be directly into a 345kV transmission line operated by the Dayton Power and Light Company, which is located 0.75 miles north of the proposed site. Natural gas to fuel the turbine generators will be supplied by a tap to an existing Columbia Gas Transmission gas pipeline that is located 1.5 miles south of the property.

The proposed facility will be constructed on a site of approximately 37 acres; however, overall the facility will occupy only approximately 25 acres on the 37-acre parcel. The overall dimensions of the facility will be approximately 1,200 feet long by 600 feet wide, and the tallest structure will be approximately 65 feet high. The station will be designed as a peaking facility that will generate electricity at times of

peak demand when electricity usage is at its greatest.

NEED FOR THE PROJECT

The proposed generating station will help ease the electricity shortages experienced during recent years in Ohio and other areas of the Midwestern United States. These shortages principally have occurred during summer months when electricity demand approaches or exceeds the available supply.

PROJECT SCHEDULE

An application for this facility will be submitted to the Ohio Power Siting Board by August 2001. Construction is expected to begin in July 2002, upon receipt of the certificate of environmental compatibility and public need and other necessary permits. Startup testing will begin by April 2003, and the station is expected to be operational by June 2003.
