ENTRY

The attorney examiner finds:

- (1) The Ohio General Assembly has passed, and the Governor signed, legislation that will require the restructuring of the electric industry and provides for retail competition with regard to the generation component of electric service (Amended Sub. Senate Bill No. 3 of the 123<sup>rd</sup> General Assembly). Section 4928.31, Revised Code, requires each electric utility to file with the Commission a transition plan for the utility's provision of retail electric service in the state of Ohio.

- (2) The Cincinnati Gas and Electric Company (CG&E), The Dayton Power and Light Company (DP&L), American Electric Power (on behalf of Ohio Power Company and Columbus Southern Power Company, hereinafter referred to as AEP), Monongahela Power Company (Monongahela), and FirstEnergy Corp. (on behalf of Ohio Edison Company, The Toledo Edison Company, and The Cleveland Electric Illuminating Company, hereinafter referred to as FirstEnergy) have or will be filing applications for approval of electric transition plans by January 3, 2000.
- (3) Pursuant to recently adopted rules, the Commission has scheduled the following technical conferences to allow interested persons an opportunity to better understand each utility's proposed transition plan.

FirstEnergy	January 4, 2000
CG&E	January 7, 2000
AEP	January 10, 2000
DP&L	January 11, 2000
Monongahela	January 12, 2000

Each utility shall have the necessary personnel in attendance at its scheduled conference so as to explain, among other things, the structure of the filing, the work papers, the data sources, and the manner in which calculations were made. The conferences shall be held at 10:00 a.m. (with the exception of DP&L's conference at 11:00 a.m.) at the offices of the Commission, 180 East Broad Street, Columbus, Ohio 43215.

It is, therefore,

ORDERED, That the above findings be observed. It is, further,

ORDERED, That a copy of this entry be served upon interested parties of record in the above-captioned cases and persons filing comments in Case No. 99-1141-EL-ORD.
