Dear Ms. Wright:

SBC Ohio (which is a registered trade name of The Ohio Bell Telephone company) (the "Company") hereby files revised maps of its Columbiana Exchange and New Waterford Exchange, without application, pursuant to Ohio Administrative Code §4901:1-3-03(F). Reduced copies of the revised maps, size 8 1/2"x 11", reflecting the proposed boundary changes are also attached. Both this letter and the reduced maps are being filed in duplicate pursuant to Ohio Administrative Code §4901:1-3-03(G).

The revised maps reflect incorporating a small portion of the SBC Ohio's New Waterford Exchange into SBC Ohio's Columbiana Exchange. The Company offers the following reasons for making this change:

1. A new housing development ("Meadowbrook") and golf course ("The Links at Firestone") are being built in an undeveloped area that is divided by the current boundary between these exchanges. Leaving this boundary as it is will result in many residents of the Meadowbrook housing development having a different local calling area from their immediate neighbors. In some cases, homes situated next to one another will have different calling areas. Also, in certain areas of this development, the current exchange boundary line runs through individual residential lots. To eliminate this situation, SBC Ohio is relocating the boundary between these exchanges. This change will allow all residents of Meadowbrook to have access to the same local calling area. SBC Ohio has been in contact with the developer who is in agreement with this change. No other SBC Ohio customers are affected by this change.
2. The areas affected by this change are the northwest corner of the New Waterford exchange and the eastern section of the Columbiana exchange. The new boundary between these exchanges will begin in the north at the corner of New Castle Road and Heck Road, proceed east of Heck Road until it turns south onto Beaver Lake Road. It then continues south following the western edge of Beaver Lake until it intersects with Highway 14, which is shown as Salem Unity Road on the map. The boundary will then turn west on Highway 14 until it connects to the current exchange boundary.
3. SBC Ohio has facilities necessary to serve the new area of the Columbiana Exchange.



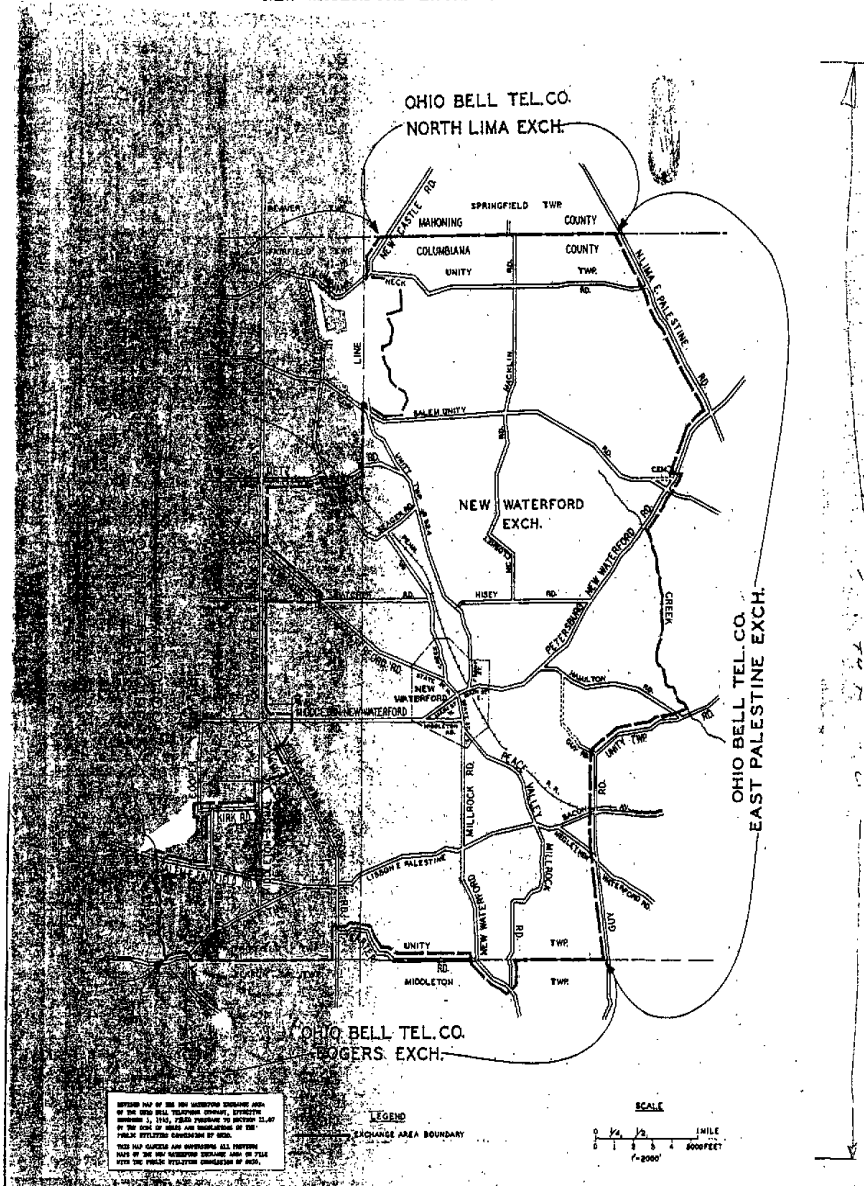

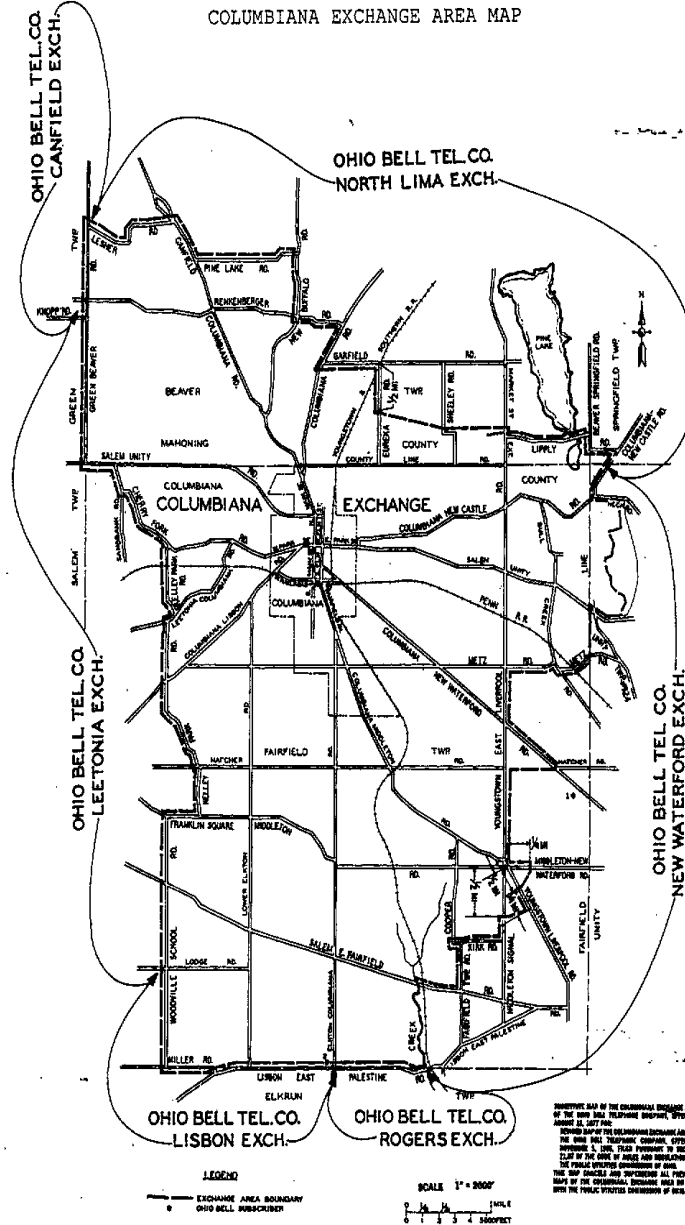
